

Korea Command Sponsorship Program (CSP) Policy Change

Effective April 5, 2016, CSP eligibility has been extended to same sex civilian spouses of military members being assigned to Korea.

Military members with a same sex civilian spouse who receive an assignment to Korea (at a non-dependent-restricted location) and elect to serve the accompanied tour will apply for CSP consideration following the instructions on this site.

Same sex military-to-military couples seeking an accompanied tour to Korea will continue to do so by pursuing a join spouse assignment. This is done by one member with an assignment to Korea (at a non-dependent-restricted location) applying for a CSP billet. In most cases, the ranking member should submit the CSP application. If the member receives a CSP billet (or was selected to fill a key billet), the service member's spouse has 10 duty days from the CSP approval notification date to request join spouse consideration (application available on vMPF) through the appropriate assignment officer/NCO.
