MEMORANDUM FOR ALL AIR FORCE PERSONNEL IN THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA
SUBJECT TO THE 7 AF CURFEW ORDER

SUBJECT: Suspension of 7 AF (AFKOR) General Order Regarding Off-Installation Curfew

1. **(U//FOUO) Suspension of Curfew Order.** In accordance with the orders of the Commander, United States Forces Korea (USFK), as referenced in USFK Tasking Order (TASKORD) 19-58, the order entitled *7 AF (AFKOR) General Order Regarding Off-Installation Curfew*, issued by this headquarters on 14 March 2019, is suspended for a period of 90-days, effective 17 June 2019 at 0800. The curfew order is *suspended*, not rescinded. All other policies and rules governing off-installation behavior remain in effect.
2. **(U//FOUO) Purpose of the Suspension.** This suspension will serve as an evaluation period in order to assess the appropriateness of maintaining a curfew. Factors which will be considered include behavior, morale and unit readiness.
3. **(U//FOUO) Direction to Subordinate Commanders.** We will honor our commitments under the Mutual Defense Treaty and preserve the trust and confidence of the people of the Republic of Korea. To that end, first and foremost, commanders are charged to take positive action to maintain the readiness of their Forces. Commanders will also sustain an appropriate state of awareness of their personnel's conduct and mission preparedness. Further, commanders will develop and maintain a culture of self-policing in their units, on and off-duty. I expect continued active engagement by command teams, robust employment of our NCO and CGO Corps during and outside of duty hours, and appropriate accountability for indiscipline and leadership failures.
4. **(U//FOUO) Deviations.** Any deviations from this suspension (i.e. imposing a curfew on anyone during the suspension period by a unit commander, senior enlisted advisor, supervisor, or other person) must be approved by either me or 7 AF/CV. This does not include punishment imposed as a result of Uniform Code of Military Justice action.
5. **(U//FOUO) Wingman System.** All AF personnel are highly encouraged to have a designated "Wingman" (identified as another service member, family member, or friend) on weekdays and weekends between the hours of 2200-0500 when conducting unofficial, off-base activities or during periods of heightened vulnerability. The designated "Wingman" is intended to enhance individual force protection requirements, ensure better care for our teammates, improve self-policing behavior, and minimize risk.
